

# HOW CAN ART CREATE AN IMPRESSION?

## Art Sticky Knowledge

- An artist is a person who creates drawings and paintings.
- Pencils can be used to create different thickness in lines.
- Lines can be curved or straight.
- Rubbings in art are made by pressing paper to a material and marking the surface.
- The primary colours are red, blue and yellow.
- The secondary colours are green, purple and orange.
- Triangles, circles, squares and rectangles are geometric shapes.
- Repeating patterns are colours, shapes and lines used more than once in the same order.
- An opinion is somebody's view on something (eg. Piece of artwork).
- Sketchbooks can be used to explore and experiment with different styles of art.
- Paint brushes, rollers and sponges can be used to create paintings.
- Artists have portrayed both a black and white world and a colour world through their art.

Vocabulary	Image	Definition
Artist		A person who creates paintings, drawings or sculptures.
Expression		Making thoughts or feelings known.
Horizontal		A line running from left to right.
Vertical		A line running from top to bottom.
Diagonal		A line running from corner to corner.
Rubbings		Paper laid over an object and a rubbing action made on top using pencil, chalk etc.
Still Life		Drawing something from real life, in front of the artist.
Primary Colours		A group of colours that can be mixed to make others.
Secondary Colours		a group of colours that are mixed using the primary colours.
Tools		Something held in your hand to carry out a special job.
Geometric		Something that has regular lines and shapes.
Repeating		Doing or saying the same thing over and over again.
Pattern		A repeating, decorative design.
Opinion		Somebody's view on something.
Artwork		Drawings, paintings, sculptures that are prepared to show others.
Landscape		Features of an area of land.
Sketchbook		A book with blank pages for art work/sketching/drawing.
Canvas		Material stretched over a frame that is used to paint on/draw on.
