



# The Green Flying High Academy

## Admissions Criteria 2026-2027



The Green Flying High Academy is part of the Flying High Partnership Multi-Academy Trust.

As an academy, we are required to set and publish our own admission criteria. Admission applications are managed through the Derbyshire Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme. For 2026-2027 the published admission arrangements remain unchanged and are in line with the Derbyshire Admission arrangements for community and voluntary controlled schools. Individual pupils who have an EHC plan which names the school will be admitted.

In deciding on admissions to The Green, the following order of priority will be adopted.

- 1. Looked after children and children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).**
- 2. Children living in the normal area served by the school at the time of application and admission who have brothers or sisters attending the school at the time of the application and admission.**
- 3. Children living in the normal area served by the school at the time of application and admission.**
- 4. Children not living in the normal area served by the school but who have brothers or sisters attending the school at the time of application and admission.**
- 5. Other children whose parents have requested a place. Where, in the case of 2,3,4 or 5 above, choices have to be made between children satisfying the same criteria, those children living nearest to the school will be given preference**

Children who join this school usually transfer from South Normanton Nursery School, South Normanton Pre- School, and Private Nurseries. In order to facilitate as smooth a transfer as possible, children joining The Green Infants are invited for a series of visits in the Summer term before joining us in the September.

Parents are invited to a New Parents meeting during the term prior to their child joining the school. This provides an opportunity to hear more about the school, ask questions and meet future class teachers and receive a Welcome Pack. Parents who move into the area are welcome to visit in order to view the school and discuss details.

The Junior School to which the children normally transfer is Glebe Junior School or Leys Junior School. We have good links with the schools and have a comprehensive transition programme during the year that ensures that the Y2 children are happy and confident about the next step in their school life. We reserve the right to withdraw any offer of a school place which has been obtained as a result of misleading or fraudulent information. Please note a place cannot be guaranteed for any child, even those living in a school's normal area.
